


Porcelain Perfection in the Kitchen

Porcelain tile slabs have proved a popular choice for floors and walls over the last few years, and now these stunning statement tiles are making their way into our kitchens too. These are all ideal qualities for worktops, especially when you consider that this means hot pans and trays can be placed directly onto the surface, with no fear of irreversible scorching.

Perhaps not so obvious at first, these beautiful slabs are also being used to great effect on the front of kitchen cabinetry too. Templated and affixed to the cabinetry off-site, the finished look is quite different to that of other kitchen door fronts and is very striking indeed. The porcelain brings a clean, stylish and modern feel, with a texture not possible from traditional kitchen cabinetry materials.

The Stone & Ceramic Warehouse recommend their Coliseum Collection for use on kitchens, using a 3mm thick slab for cabinet door fronts, and a 12mm thick slab for worktops. The tile slabs are available in various sizes up to a huge 1.62m x 3.24m, perfect for even the largest of worktops. For those preferring the look of a chunkier worktop, the edges of the slab can have a mitre joint to attach a downstand, creating a thicker appearance.
